COMMUNITY CHRISTIAN CHOIR ANNOUNCES “CENTER-PEACE” CONCERTS

March 19, 2008 – Pat Weitz, Director of the Community Christian Choir has announced the concert slate for their 27th season of Benefit concerts for the Central New Jersey region will begin on April 20th. “This is a very exciting season for the CCC and its Children’s Choir. Our concerts this season will be sharing a special message of peace. Something this world desperately needs right now”, said Ms. Weitz, director of the multi-denominational contemporary Christian music group. With a mission to provide excellence in choral ministry, the CCC has over 130 members ranging from age 5 to Adult.

Having performed over 120 concerts over the last 13 years and raised over \$115,000 for local charities, the CCC has named their season “Center-Peace” and is challenging its audiences to find peace and balance through Christ. Performing three free concerts over the region, the CCC will be benefiting the Interfaith Quiet Fund, Project Freedom and Fund for Ethan. All proceeds from good-will offerings taken at the concerts are donated directly to the charities.

The three public concerts begin with the April 20th concert held at the Robbinsville Seventh Day Adventist Church, Robbinsville, NJ. Project Freedom will be the benefit at the 6 pm concert.

On May 4th, a very special concert will be held at 3 pm at the Millstone Performing Arts Center, Perrineville, NJ. This concert will benefit Interfaith Quiet Fund, a Millstone Township organization of churches and synagogues that work together to help those in financial stress within the community. Also of special note for the May 4th concert will be the performance of renowned artist Mark Demel, otherwise known as the “Sand Artist”.
